PLACEMENT CELL

A full-fledged Training & Placement Cell provides guidance to students on career opportunities in the college under the guidance of a Placement officer. KKCAS has established a separate Placement and Training Cell with highly qualified faculty to groom and place the students. Series of seminars and training are conducted under this cell to train and equip the students for campus recruitment.

A finishing school programme is conducted during the summer vacation for the UG & PG pre final year students in which they are trained by HR personnel from reputed companies and Professional Trainers. This is a unique programme conducted only in our college. NSS

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

1. Classes will commence at 9.00 am and will go on up to 2.30 pm with a lunch break between 12.15 pm – 1.00 pm. Students must be punctual to the classes. They are not allowed to abstain from classes without prior permission and valid reason.
2. Students must abide by the rules and regulations of the college and maintain strict discipline in the Campus.
3. Students shall be regular and punctual not only in attending classes but also in participating in all extra Curricular and co-curricular activities of the college.
4. Usage of mobile phones is strictly prohibited inside the college campus.

LIBRARY RULES

1. The library will be kept open from 8.30am to 4.30pm on all working days.

FEE REGULATIONS

1. Fee is payable in advance as notified through the circular.
2. Fee once paid will not be refunded under any circumstance.
3. The semester fee shall be paid in one sum on or before but not later than the date mentioned.
4. Students are required to retain the receipts, duly signed by the Accountant, issued to them for all the fee paid.
5. If a student fails to pay the fee on the fifteenth working day of the semester, a fine at the rate of rupees temper day shall be levied.
6. If a student fails to pay the fee before the date mentioned in the circular (with or without fine) his / her name will be struck off from the rolls.
7. If a student leaves the college after being enrolled he / she shall have no right to claim a remission of the fee or any portion of the fee.
8. If a student leaves the college in the middle of the course, he should pay the balance fee for the entire course.
9. Every student admitted into the college should buy the text books prescribed by the department.

EXAMINATION FEE

No student shall be permitted to appear for the End Assessment Examination unless the examination fee is remitted through the college office or through online in the stipulated date informed by 'The Controller of Examinations'.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ATTENDANCE

- Category I** : **Above 75%** of attendance and eligible to write the examination in current semester subjects
- Category II** : **65% to 74%** of attendance but eligible for condonation and eligible to write the examination in current semester subjects
- Category III** : **55% to 64%** attendance and not eligible for condonation and eligible to write the examination only in arrear subjects and not regular subjects. Can continue the course but condense the loss of attendance during next semester.
- Category IV** : **Below 55%** of attendance and not eligible to write the examination in current semester subjects, has to discontinue the course and re do the same semester during the next academic year.

RESTRICTION TO TAKE THE EXAMINATIONS

- a) Any candidate having arrear paper(s) shall have the option to take the examinations in any arrear paper(s) along with the subsequent regular semester papers.
- b) Candidates who fail in any of the papers shall pass the paper(s) concerned within five years from the date of admission to the said course. If they fail to do so, they shall take the examination in the revised text / syllabus, if any, prescribed for the immediate next batch of candidates. If there is no change in the text / syllabus they shall take the examination in that paper with the syllabus in vogue, until there is a change in the text or syllabus. In the event of removal of that paper consequent to the change of regulations and / or curriculum after a five year period, the candidates shall have to take up a equivalent paper in the revised syllabus as suggested by the Chairman of the Board of Studies and full fill the requirements as per regulations/curriculum for the award of the degree.

- End Assessment examinations for the odd semester will generally be held during November and for even semester during April.
- The question papers for Part I, Part II and Part III courses will be set by the external examiners and Part IV and Extra Credit Courses may be set by the internal or external examiners.
- UG (Batch: 2023-26 , 2024 – 27 & 2025 - 28) : The examination will be conducted for a maximum of 75 marks for three hours. The passing minimum is 40% (30 out of 75 marks) and overall passing minimum putting the CIA and EAE marks together will be 40%.
- PG (Batch: 2024 – 27 & 2025 - 28): The exams for Core and Elective will be conducted for a maximum of 75 marks for three hours. The passing minimum for CIA and EAE is 50% (38 out of 75 Marks) and overall passing minimum putting the CIA and EAE marks together will be 50 % (50 out of 100).

VALUATION DETAILS

- UG: There will be one independent valuation for all theory papers of UG courses by external examiner, except for Self Study courses, Value Based Education, Non-Major Electives, Skill Based Subject and Extra Credit Courses, for which the valuation may be Internal or External.
- PG: There will be two Independent evaluations for all theory courses with first valuation by the course faculty and the second valuation by external examiner. The average marks of first and second valuation will be taken as the final marks. If there is a difference of 15% or more between the first and second valuation, then the paper will be referred for third valuation and the average of the marks which are closer among the three valuations will be taken as the final marks
- Supplementary examination will be conducted for the benefit of final year students (both UG & PG) after 15 days of the declaration of the final semester results. Candidate, who has arrear in any semester subject to maximum of one paper, can appear for the supplementary examination conducted after the final semester.
- A candidate may request for re-totalling / revaluation of his/her answer script by submitting application addressing to the Controller of Examination through the Principal, paying prescribed fee. This provision is available for all theory papers taken in the EAE. However there is no provision for revaluation of practical paper of UG courses and for practical and theory papers of PG Courses.
- Candidates desirous of improving the marks awarded in a passed subject in their first attempt shall reappear once within a period of subsequent two semesters. The improved marks shall be considered for classification but not for ranking. When there is no improvement, there shall not be any change in the original marks already awarded.

CONFERMENT OF THE DEGREE

No candidate shall be conferred the degree unless he/she has undergone the prescribed course of study for a period of not less than six semesters in UG courses and four semesters in PG courses in the college, and has passed in all the courses in the examinations conducted in the college
